

CATEGORIES FOR SUBMISSIONS TO JANH

Original Submissions

Articles should not exceed 10,000 words and should include an abstract of 250 words. There are no limitations on references. History abstracts may be unstructured; research abstracts should be structured.

Newly Advanced Historical Theories: Scholarly theories advanced with supporting references and observations.
Newly Uncovered Historical Sources: Newly uncovered historical source(s) (apparatus, pharmaceuticals, written materials, audiovisual media, etc.)
Research studies: Quantitative and qualitative studies on information of interest to the history community

Derivative Submissions

Articles should not exceed 10,000 words and should include an abstract of 250 words. History abstracts may be unstructured. There are no limitations on references.

Transcriptions: Handwritten source(s) transcribed and cross-checked into digitized American English
Translations: Source(s) translated into American English from a different language

Review Submissions

Articles should not exceed 10,000 words and should include an abstract of 250 words. Book reviews and commentaries do not have abstracts. Historical reviews have unstructured abstracts. There are no limitations on references.

Book Reviews & Other Media Reviews: Review of a specific item available in historical literature or audiovisual media
Commentaries: Thoughtful presentation of original ideas unrelated to an article published in the Journal of Anesthesia History
Editorials: Discussion of another original, derivative, or review article published in the Journal of Anesthesia History
Historical Reviews: Heavily referenced summary of the literature involving a topic in the history of anesthesia or in related disciplines

Brief Submissions

Ethereal images and letters to the editors should not exceed 500 words. Short communications should not exceed 1500 words and should include an abstract of 250 words.

Ethereal Images: Pictorials with vignettes and preferably 1 to 3 references
Letters to the Editor: Correspondence regarding topics related to anesthesia history or recent Journal of Anesthesia History publications
Short communications: Brief, appropriately referenced, notes on topics related to anesthesia history

Editorials

Editorials: Discussion of another original, derivative, or review article published in the Journal of Anesthesia History
